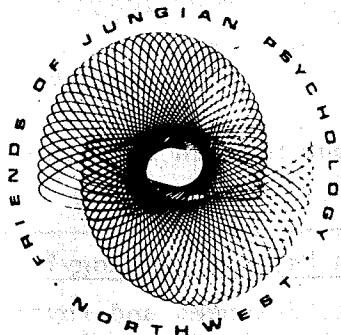

Program of Monthly Meetings

October 13 A Psychological Approach to Greek Mythology, by Edward Edinger, Jungian Analyst

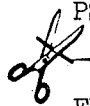
Study Groups

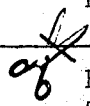
