SALLY PARKS & FRED DAVIS: REFLECTION ON A FREUD-JUNG SYMPOSIUM

On May 21st and 22nd of this year, the second Freud-Jung Symposium was held in San Francisco. Sally Parks and Fred Davis will share some of their reflections on the symposium.

The contributions of Sigmund Freud and Carl Gustav Jung have had revolutionary effects on the theory and

practice of psychotherapy and concepts of human development. Both of these innovators attempted to devise effective methods of treatment based on their view of the nature and function of the psyche. Over the years germinal ideas in their writings continue to lead to new directions in clinical work and research.

The May symposium was designed to present an examination of ideas from the Freudian and Jungian traditions concerning the nature of the mind and the conduct of psycho-Speakers discussed a therapy. range of issues including concepts of normalcy and psychopathology, the use of dreams in treatment, the nature of transference. The intent of the symposium was to develop clarity about what were the origional similarities and contrasts of thought on these topics by both men and how these traditions have expanded over time.

SALLY PARKS is a Diplomate of the Inter-regional Society of Jungian Analysts and a member of the Washington State Clinical Social Workers Association. She is a founding member of the Friends of Jungian Psychology Northwest.

FRED DAVIS is a Diplomate of the Seattle Psychoanalytic Society and Clinical Assistent Professor in Child Psychiatry at the University of Washington Medical School.

TROY ELMORE-TABOR: MASK: EYE TO THE SELF

This will be a lecture and slide show of selected masks from around the world. Troy percievs the mask as a bridge between the conscious and unconscious minds. In her work, she promotes the mask as an affecting presence in serious play. Her discussion will focus on myth, ritual, symbol, duality and movement in relation to the use of masks.

TROY ELMORE-TABOR is a free-lance artist and anthropologist who lives in Seattle. Her graduate work in psychology and anthropology was concerned with the mask as an avenue to a deeper understanding of human behavior. She has done research in Australia, North America, Europe and China.

Monday November 21, 7:30 p.m. STEPHAN HOELLER: ALCHEMY

Stephan Hoeller will present a lecture and discussion of the significance of alchemical symbolism to the process of individuation in Jungian thought. He will use Jung's Psychology and Alchemy as the basis for his lecture.

STEPHAN HOELLER is currently Executive Direcator of the Gnostic Society in Los Angeles. He is professor of comparative religion and has written The Gnostic Jung and the Seven Sermans to the Dead and The Royal Road. He studied at the University of Innsbruck, Austria and has taught religious studies at UCLA.
