NEW ACQUISITIONS:

--Murray Stein's Jung's Treatment of Christianity, an innovative study of Jung's writings on the trinity, the mass, alchemy, the Bible, and various biblical figures. The author describes how Jung took modern Christianity under his psychotherapeutic care in an effort to help it evolve to its next stage of development.

--Ann Belford Ulanov's The Feminine in Jungian Psychology and Christian Theology is good background reading for the Rev. Laura Cameron Fraser's October 19 workshop. The author's purpose is to gather together in one volume what Jung and Jungians have discovered about the feminine and to explore their approach in order to see the place of the feminine in Christian theology, and to make connections between theology and depth psychology.

Laura Cameron Fraser: A PRIEST RESPONDS TO JUNG'S TREATMENT OF CHRISTIANITY

Has the church accomplished any of the developmental tasks Jung annunciated? How does the Christian church help or hinder the development of consciousness for modern people? Part of the church continues to mouth its ancient mysteries with no grasp of—and, thus, no participation of the heart in—the profundities of which it is guardian. Part of the church is estranged from its roots, seeking nourishment elsewhere, while some—especially those remembering Jung's warning regarding the hazards in seeking a spiritual path foreign to one's own psychic history—have stayed with, or returned to, the church, pressing her to feed her children.


